

## Pipkin Land Entries in Wayne County, NC

<u>Dobbs County Land Entries, 1778-1790</u> (Wayne County was carved out of Dobbs in 1779) (Lenoir County was carved out of Dobbs in 1791)


Willis Pipkin, Jan 1778 - No. 28, 100 acres in Dobbs on a branch of Mill Creek and north side of Neuse River being within the boundaries of a tract of land he lives on.



Arthur Pipkin - Jan 1778 - No. 243, 150 acres in Dobbs in the fork of Falling Creek on the No. side of Buck Swamp joining his own, Sarah Crows, Charles Cogdell and Joseph Pipkin's lines.



Joseph Pipkin (d. 1789) - Jan 1778 - No. 245, 200 acres in Dobbs beginning at Benjamin Jernigans line, joining Jesse Musgroves, Joseph Sessions & Stephen Pipkins lines.



Elisha Pipkin - 1778 - No. 246, 500 acres in Dobbs on the No. side of Falling Creek beginning at his own line tract, Joshua Granthams, joining Benja. Jernigans, John Bizills & Joseph Pipkins lines.



Jesse Pipkin – Mar 1778 - No. 285, 150 acres in Dobbs on the No. side of Panther Creek joining Joseph Bentons & Isaac Hines's lines.
