(Lenoir County was carved out of Dobbs in 1791)

Willis Pipkin, Jan 1778 - No. 28, 100 acres in Dobbs on a branch of Mill Creek and north side of Neuse River being within the boundaries of a tract of land he lives on.

Arthur Pipkin - Jan 1778 - No. 243, 150 acres in Dobbs in the fork of Falling Creek on the No. side of Buck Swamp joining his own, Sarah Crows, Charles Cogdell and Joseph Pipkin's lines.
